## ROAD ROUTE SELECTED

St. Johns Scenle Highway Will Extend Through Throo Countles of State.

ACCRONVILLIBI, Fla., Feb. 21.—The proposed scepto highway along the St. Johns river through parts of St. Johns, Duval and Putnam countion was routed Saturday at a conterence between county officials and Dr. Fons A. Hathaway, chairman of the state road department, and L. K. Cannon, state highway engineer, The highway officials returned to Jacksonville Saturday from St. Augustine, where the conference was conducted.

The road will be built by the counties under the supervision of the state. Through St. Johns county, the road has been included in a \$2,250,000 bond issue voted recently. It will extend from a point on state road No. 4, about 10 miles south of Jackson-ville, to Hastings, near Palatka, following the St. Johns river and intersecting state road No. 14.

St. Johns county is the first of the three interested counties to vote bonds for the purpose. This county money will be used in clearing grubbing, grading, draining and bridging the road, and its position on the second preferential list of state roads assures it an early surfacing by the state department. It will form one of the most beautiful drives in the state, extending over a distance of about 45 miles.
