Will Conform With New 1926 Law; Drastic Reductions In

Revenue On Tobacco. NCOME tax blanks for corporations and for those persons having an income of more than \$5,000 have been mailed to Miami, according to O. W. Pittman, division chief of internal revenue. These blanks, with instructions for filing, will conform with the new tax law of 1926 which was passed in Washington the week.

on this week. According to an unofficial report eccived by Mr. Pittman, the out-tanding features of the new tax aw are as follows: The gift tax has been repealed, ef

ective from January 1, 1926.
There is to be no tax on admissions of 75 cents or under.
Tax on automobiles has been re-

Tax on automobiles has been reduced from 5 per cent to 3 per cent with no tax at all on motor trucks and motor wagons.

Tax on brokers, pawn, brokers, ship brokers, customs house brokers, bowling alleys, pool tables, shooting galleries, riding academies and the operation or renting of automobiles for hir has been repealed. This is for hire has been repealed. This is effective from January 36.

A DRASTIC reduction of cigar and cigarette taxes also was passed, and a refund will be paid to all those dealers, brokers, and manufacturers who have stock on hand on which tax already has been paid. The new rate for cigars is as follows:

The new rate for eights is as for lows:

A tax of \$2 a 1,000 on cigars selling for 5 cents and under, instead of \$4. On those retailing between 5 and 8 cents a tax of \$3 a 1,000 instead of \$6. On those selling for more than 8 cents and less than 15 cents the tax will be \$5 instead of \$9. On cigars selling for more than 15 cents and less than 20 cents, \$10,50 instead of \$12. On all cigars solling for more than 20 cents, the tax will be \$13.50 instead of \$15. The new forms and the instructions are expected to arrive by today and will be distributed as soon as they arrive in Miami, Mr. Pittman said yesterday.




