



band of Seminole Indians is suffering extreme hardships by reason of the flooding of the 100,000 acre reservation in the southeastern part of Lee county was expressed by residents of that county who visited Tampa yesterday. According to the Information brought to this city, practically the entire Big Cypress region is inundated as the result of heavy and long continued rains throughout practically all of South Florida, and that water now covers all of that portion of the Everglades in Lee county to depths of from one to six feet.

It was stated that the villages of Bare Beach, Ritta, Clewiston, Okelanta and other small places along the southwestern shore of Lake Okee-chobee were under water, and that the level of the big lake is rising at the rate of an inch or two every there, totaled nearly eighteen inches, while the rainfall for the first nine months of this year has been more than ten inches in excess of the entire average annual rainfall for that place, with three months of the year remaining.

Persons acquainted with conditions in Lee county state, however, that the unprecedented rains there have sorved to render large areas of rich trucking lands available for cultivation this year that otherwise would have been useless. In the storm of last October these lands, as well as several islands off the Lee county coast, were swept by the waters from the Gulf and the soil was so impregnated with salt that it was believed the land could not be used for several years. The troical downpours of September, it was stated, have washed the salt out of the soil, and large acreages will be planted to winter vegetables as soon as the soil becomes sufficiently dry after the rains.

Telegraphic and telephone messages from points near Lake Okeechobee last night were to the effect that the waters of the lake are higher than they have been for many years. Moore Haven reported that the Kissimmee river, flowing into Lake Okeechobee at its northern end, was fully a mile wider from bank to bank than it ever had been in the memory of the oldest inhabitants.

Engineers of the Florida internal improvement board are investigating flood conditions in Dade county and along the banks of the various canals and the shores of Lake Okeechobee. It is expected that engineers from the U. S. bureau of engineering, war department, at Jacksonville, will be sent to the flooded divicts in the next few days, to make special investigations along the government works connecting the upper Caloosahatchee river, Lake Hiepochee and Lake Okeechobee, in the vicinity of LaBelle, Goodno, Fort Denaud and other places in the section reported to be inundated.

#### Frady Must Remain In Jail Until New Deed Is Executed

MIAMI, Oct. 4.—Edgar C. Frady, Chicago automobile man, charged with the murder of his wife, Dorothy Frady, will have to remain in the Dade county jail until next week at least as new complications have arisen in the securing of his bond of \$50,000.

Local bondsmen require a cash guarantee, to secure which Frady is mortgaging certain Chicago, properly. Today a request came from Chicago that a new deed must be made before the money would be forthcoming. It will require three days to mail the deed back to Chicago. An order admitting Frady to bond was entered last week by Judge E. C. Davis of West Palm Bench under habeas corpus proceedings brought in Frady's behalf in which it was contended that he is suffering from an incurable disease and will die it, confined in jail until his trial in Jauary. 
