But the committee takes pains to em-phasize the invitation, but, if you haven't got a basket, don't fail to come you anyway, and a square deal is assured for everybody and his candidate.

Okeechobee county, the youngest in the state, has cause to be proud of herself and she wants to show all the candidates that she appreciates them, even if she cannot elect them all to office the first time. The invitation is extended to every-
