Construction Totals Pass \$1,000, 000 Mark; Heavy Payrolls Are Forecast.

[HERALD SERVICE.] OKEECHOBEE, Pla., April 29.-This city is facing a prosperous summer with more than \$1,000.000 in new construction work under way ing, turpentine and fishing industries in full operation and hundreds of acres of rich muck and prairie lands being brought under cultivation by new settlers. A survey made this morning showed at least 400 men engaged in construction work on important projects, about 30 in addition to normal business and industrial

Among the larger tasks now under way are a new \$250,000 court house. \$165,00 high school building, new city electrical system, new telephone sys-tem, and \$45,000 Baptist Church. Business, industrial and home conruction work is in progress in many

HEAVY payrolls throughout the summer and ample employment for skilled and unskilled labor are assured not only in the special, but in the lumbering and other industries. More than 1,000 men are employed by the St. Andrews Bay Lumber Company three miles east of the city, producing daily 200,000 feet of lumber.

Contracts have been let for 12 miles of paved streets, to be completed before the opening of the winter seaoctore the opening of the winter sea-son. Nine miles of the Eagle Bay drive connecting Okeechobee with Moore Haven is to be constructed this summer, according to W. W. Potter, chairman of the board of county commissioners.


