He was an avid gardener and member of Foster Drive Baptist Church. He was a 55-year member of the Scottish Rite Masonry and a 32nd Degree Master Mason. He was most recently a member of the Albert J Russell Lodge. He was also a member of the Morocco Shrine Temple.

He is survived by his daughters, Kathleen Crook (Monty) and Betty Bearden (Jim) of Green Cove Springs, and Sharon Miller (Joseph) of Huntsville, Al; sisters, Doris Bryant and Eva Fletcher; brother, Donald C.
