OKEECHOBEE GETS BIG PREMIUM ON BONDS

Issued \$110,000 For Better Water Realizes \$116,935 in Sale

Okeechobee City, Fla., April 26.— Spirited bidding by 14 bond houses, the Bank of Okeechobee, and the Peoples Bank of Okeechobee, culminated with the Bank of Okeechobee as the successful bidder for the \$110,000 worth of waterworks extension bonds for the city of Okeechobee. The highest price ever paid for 6 per cent municipal bonds, is declared to have been paid at this auction when the \$116,935 was paid by the Bank of Okeechobee for the \$110,000 issue. Several representatives of bond houses present stated that it was probably the highest price ever paid for 6 per cent municipal bonds in Florida and indicated, they said, that the bond market was not only good at this time but that bond houses had faith in the future growth of Okeechobee City.

The bond houses represented at the sale were: R. L. Ballenger and company, Cincinnati; Steiner Bros., Birmingham; Seasongood & Mayer, Well, Roth, Irving and company, Walter Woody and Heinerdinger, J. C. Mayer & Co., all of Cincinnati; Vandersall and company, W. L. Slaten and company, Ryan-Sutherland company, Stranahan, Harris and Otis company, all of Toledo, Ohio; Henchett Bond company, and Thompson, Kent and Grace, Chicago; and Keen-Higbee and company, Detroit.

This bond issue sold at a premium of 6.305 per cent and the Bank of Okeechobee, the purchasers, have bought every bond issue and time warrant issue of the city and county in the past, also \$246,000 worth of Palm Beach county drainage bonds.

The revenue from the new bonds will be used to install a filtration plant on Lake Okeechobee and will give Okeechobee the purest and best of water. This new water supply will mean ample water for the new subdivisions of Okeechobee.
